THE TEACHER

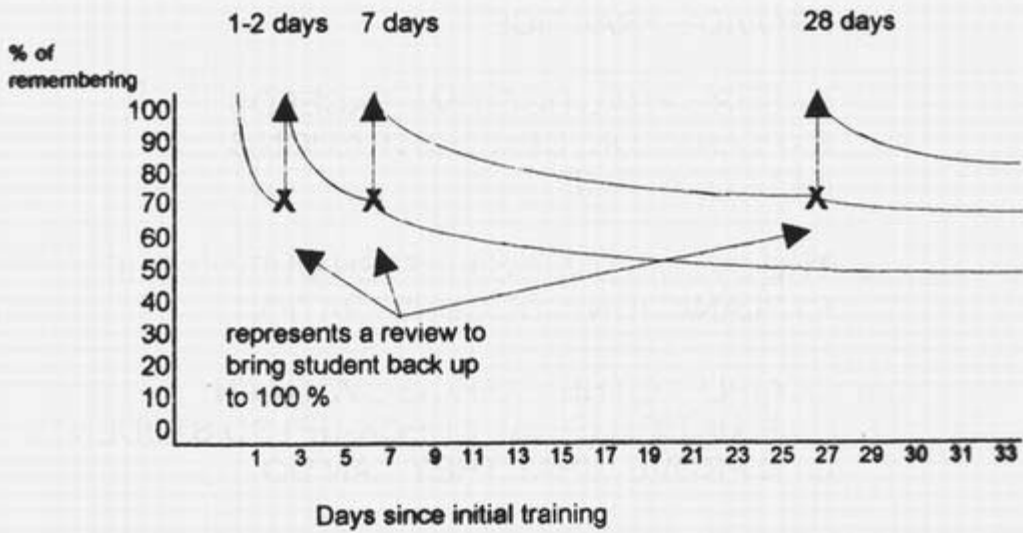
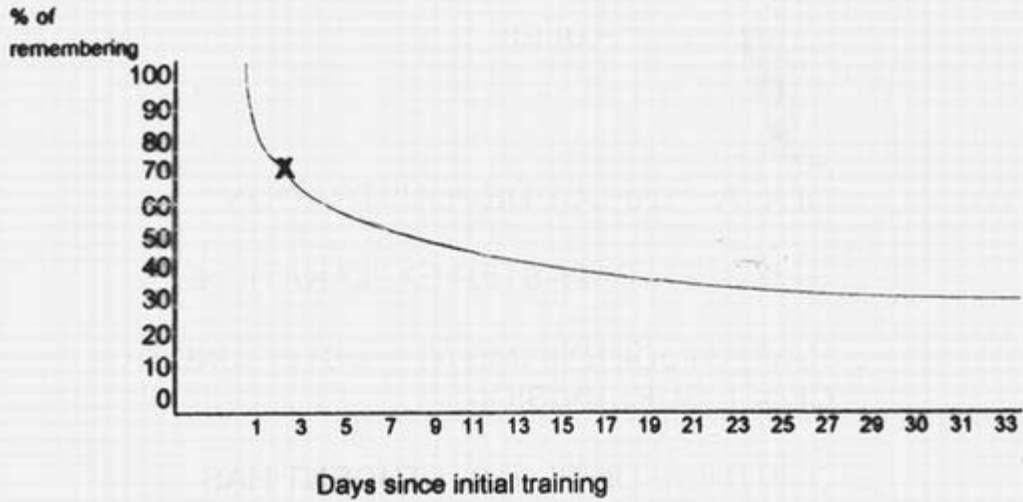
YOUR JOB IS NOT TO TEACH BUT TO HAVE THE STUDENTS LEARN!

LEARNING FACTORS/TOOLS

(Ministry of Transport Flight Instructor Guide 1989)

READINESS	ensure the students are ready to learn
PRIMACY	teach it right the first time
RELATIONSHIP	present lessons in a logical sequence, known to unknown, simple to complex, easy to difficult
EXERCISE	ensure students are engaged in meaningful activity
INTENSITY	use dramatic, realistic, unexpected things - they are remembered longer
EFFECT	ensure students gain a feeling of satisfaction from taking part in the lesson
RECENCY	summarize and practise the important points at the end of each lesson
